

Why Is Earning Your Own Money Important?

Key Terms to Know

- **1. Income –** Money you earn from doing work or providing a service.
- **2.** Hourly Pay Money earned for each hour of work.
- 3. Gig Work Short tasks or jobs, like babysitting or dog walking.
- **4. Entrepreneur –** Someone who creates a business or service.

Note: Starting a business can involve things like taxes or permits. It's a good idea to ask an adult or professional for guidance.
